**Boundary Review – What’s the latest?**

Due to rising enrollments and overcrowding, the District is going through a review of all school boundaries and we realize that many of you have questions about the process. One common question is whether the District has already started revising boundaries. The

answer is no. Any boundary revision recommendation would be the product of a citizen-based Boundary Review Committee, which will start its work this August. Applications for the committee will open on **February 27.**
